## **Statement of Jane Doe 1**

Let me begin by saying thank you to Attorney Gloria Allred for her lifelong advocacy and support on behalf of victims everywhere. Her courage and commitment is an inspiration to me and so many others. Thank you to the media here today.

It was shocking to hear that Nathaniel Radimak, aka the Tesla road rage driver, was being released this week after serving only 10-months of his five-year sentence!

Nathaniel Radimak repeatedly made deliberate, intentional, choices to attack victims citywide on multiple occasions. Almost all the victims were women, and some were senior citizens. This was not one isolated incident, which begs the question: Is there hope to rehabilitate repeat offenders?

I would like to believe there are and that people are worthy of a second chance. I pray that Nathaniel Radimak's brief time behind bars taught him a lesson.

However, lenient sentencing, closing jails, early parole releases and parole boards continue to allow perpetrators to walk free after serving minimal jail time, putting innocent people at risk and sending criminals the wrong message. People should be outraged by the lack of protection and rights of victims.

Prop 47 was mis-labeled as "The Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act", but I don't know of <u>anyone</u> who would agree that those propositions improved public safety and made our neighborhoods safer.

The LA District Attorney let many of the victims of Nathaniel Radimak down! He plays an essential role in prosecuting crimes and ensuring offenders are held accountable for their actions, but this did not happen! Our constitutional rights were violated and were not followed by the D.A.'s office. He did not properly represent our rights. In November, lets hold the D.A. accountable for his failure to protect victims like us!
