Claimant Michelle [REDACTED] (“Claimant”/“Ms. [REDACTED]”) brings this claim against Pechanga Resort Casino, located at 45000 Pechanga Pkwy., Temecula, CA 92592 as the Gaming Operation (“Pechanga”) and against its employee, Pechanga Food Service Captain [REDACTED], pursuant to the provisions of the Pechanga Gaming Facility Tort Liability Act of 2008 (hereinafter “Tribal Ordinance”).

I. STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS

Pursuant to the Tribal Ordinance § 9, Claimant timely brings her claim within 180 calendar days of receipt of the written notice of the Tribal Dispute Resolution Process. Pursuant to the aforementioned, Claimant timely brings her claim on or before **September 30, 2020**.

As confirmed by USPS tracking information, on April 3, 2020 at 10:36 a.m., written notice of the Tribal Dispute Resolution Process from Claims Administrator Ron Randazzo (“Mr. Randazzo”) was received by Claimant. A true and correct copy of USPS Tracking No. 70180680000116466101 is attached hereto as **Attachment A**. The aforementioned tracking information for the written notice dated March 31, 2020 was provided to Claimant’s counsel on April 8, 2020. True and correct copies of the March 31, 2020 written notice from Mr. Randazzo and the April 8, 2020 email from Mr. Randazzo providing the aforementioned tracking information are attached hereto as **Attachment B** and **Attachment C**, respectively.

Based on the foregoing, Claimant was required to bring her claim on or before September 30, 2020, within 180 days of April 3, 2020, the date when she received written notice of the Tribal Dispute Resolution Process from Mr. Randazzo.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTUAL BASIS OF CLAIM

As required pursuant to Tribal Ordinance § 10(b)(2), Claimant Michele [REDACTED] provides the following concise statement of the factual basis of this Claim, including the date, time, place, and circumstance of the act or omission.

The facts and circumstances of this claim arise out of injuries sustained by Ms. [REDACTED] on March 14, 2020 at Pechanga Resort Casino, located at 45000 Pechanga Pkwy., Temecula, CA 92592 (“Pechanga”). Ms. [REDACTED] sustained injuries as a result of, without limitation, Pechanga’s negligent hiring, retention, and supervision of Pechanga Food Service Captain Jose [REDACTED], Pechanga Guest Services Supervisor [REDACTED], and others. Furthermore, Ms. [REDACTED] brings this claim for injuries sustained as a result of Pechanga’s negligent maintenance of lock and key card security systems for room access, including Room 10470 where Ms. [REDACTED] was staying and the tortious actions of Pechanga employees [REDACTED], Supervisor [REDACTED] and other presently unknown employees and/or agents.

On March 14, 2020, Claimant [REDACTED] was a guest of the Pechanga Resort Casino and was staying in Room 10470 on the fourth floor of Tower One by herself. Ms. [REDACTED] planned with a friend to go to a concert with a friend and stay the night at Pechanga. Due to COVID-19 related concerns, her friend declined to go. Ms. [REDACTED] thought it would be safe to go to Pechanga alone and kept the room reservation. When she arrived at Pechanga, Ms. [REDACTED] was the only guest registered to Room 10470 and the only guest who had a key card issued for access to the room.

Ms. [REDACTED] spent time on the casino floor and consumed alcoholic beverages, some of which were provided free of charge. At approximately 11:15 p.m., when Ms. [REDACTED] started feeling intoxicated, she attempted to return to her room at the casino – Room 10470. Surveillance video from the elevator showed Ms. [REDACTED] was having difficulty keeping her balance. Notwithstanding her intoxication, Ms. [REDACTED] made it to her room, Room 10470, safely. When she arrived at her door, she attempted to use the key card that she had been issued earlier that day. However, Ms. [REDACTED]'s room key card did not work. Instead of unlocking the door, a yellow/orange light appeared on the key card pad falsely indicating that the room had been locked from the inside.

Ms. [REDACTED] walked to the elevator lobby and called the front desk for assistance using the guest phone. She spoke with Supervisor [REDACTED], who informed her that a new key card would be brought to her. Supervisor [REDACTED] noticed that Ms. [REDACTED] was intoxicated. After speaking with Supervisor [REDACTED], Ms. [REDACTED] went back to door 10470 and waited for a working key card. Nobody came.

Ms. [REDACTED] went back to the guest phone near the elevator and again asked that a working key card be brought up to her. She then went back to door 10470 and waited for a working key card. Pechanga Food Service Captain [REDACTED] saw Ms. [REDACTED] sitting on the floor in the hallway by her door. In a statement given to law enforcement, [REDACTED] indicated that he recognized that Ms. [REDACTED] was intoxicated.

[REDACTED] came up to Ms. [REDACTED] and asked her if there was a problem. Ms. [REDACTED] explained to [REDACTED] that her key card was not working and gave her card to [REDACTED] for him to try. [REDACTED] confirmed that the key card was not working and informed Ms. [REDACTED] that the blinking yellow/orange light on the door's key card pad meant that someone was inside the room, had locked the door from inside the room, and was preventing access to the room. [REDACTED] had Ms. [REDACTED] confirm, multiple times, that she was alone at the casino and that no one else could possibly be in the room. The thought that someone could be in her room, however, frightened her. Because [REDACTED] was an employee of Pechanga and because she was frightened that there may be someone in her room, Ms. [REDACTED] entrusted [REDACTED] with the information that she had traveled to the resort by herself and was staying in the room alone. Thus, [REDACTED] used his position as an employee at the hotel to obtain the information that Ms. [REDACTED] was alone and that no one else was in her hotel room.

In fact, the door to Ms. ██████'s unit was not locked from inside the room. Based on law enforcement investigative records and the Interrogation Report for the Door Lock to Room 10470, the key card panel was malfunctioning, preventing Ms. ██████ from safely entering her room on her own. Based upon law enforcement reports, it was known to Pechanga that the key cards/pads were known to malfunction. Nevertheless, they were negligently maintained and/or repaired. Pechanga Resort Casino and its employees failed to take reasonable steps to ensure the safety of guests, including Ms. ██████, by negligently maintaining and/or repairing the resort's key card system, including the door lock for Room 10470.

After some time, Supervisor ██████ arrived with another key card. According to law enforcement report, Supervisor ██████ also recognized that Ms. ██████ was intoxicated and having difficulty standing up. ██████ physically assisted Ms. ██████ in standing up because of her level of intoxication. Supervisor ██████ informed her that the key card system often malfunctioned. Supervisor ██████ gave Ms. ██████ a new key, which she used to gain entry to her room. Supervisor ██████ and ██████ then left after Ms. ██████ entered her room.

Ms. ██████ prepared to go to bed. Ms. ██████ heard a knock at her door. Upon opening the door, Ms. ██████ found that ██████ had returned to her room, unaccompanied by any other Pechanga employee. It was negligent for Pechanga to allow ██████ to go back to the room of an obviously intoxicated guest without a specific request from the occupant.

Ms. ██████ asked why he was there. She had not asked for any further assistance, and she wanted to go to sleep. ██████ knew that Ms. ██████ was alone in her room. Because Ms. ██████ was preparing to go to sleep, she was partially clothed. ██████ then repeatedly pressured Ms. ██████ to let him into her room by asking her multiple times if she needed anything.

████████ gained entrance into Ms. ██████'s room. Pechanga negligently allowed an unaccompanied employee to needlessly enter the room of a guest, who was not asking for assistance, who was known to be intoxicated, and who was only partially clothed. ██████ gained access through the use of the rights, duties, and responsibilities negligently granted to him by Pechanga. Specifically, ██████ gained access to Ms. ██████'s room by offering to assist her in the opening of her room's minibar.

Instead of giving the obviously intoxicated guest some water from the minibar, ██████ needlessly removed a champagne bottle from the service minibar. Based on a Bartech printout, a purchase is made from the minibar whenever an item is removed from its location. As such, ██████ caused the purchase of additional alcohol to the already-intoxicated Ms. ██████. ██████ then proceeded to pour Ms. ██████ a glass of champagne, despite knowing that she was intoxicated, describing her state to law enforcement as "wasted." By removing and purchasing the bottle of champagne from the minibar and giving her additional alcohol, ██████ violated ordinary and reasonable standards, policies, practices, and/or protocols and acted in violation of applicable laws.

Pechanga failed to properly train and supervise its employees, including ██████████, regarding reasonable standards, policies, practices, and/or protocols and the law related to purchasing and serving alcoholic beverages to guests. Pechanga negligently supervised ██████████ and allowed him to remain alone with Ms. ██████████ in the room for an unreasonable amount of time. Pechanga negligently had no means of supervising its employees in the hallways of the hotel. Any reasonable supervision and/or surveillance system would have alerted and notified Pechanga, including Supervisor ██████████, that ██████████ was alone in Room 10470 without any legitimate reason to be there and/or for an unreasonable amount of time.

Next, Ms. ██████████ recalls finding ██████████ on top of her as he was sexually assaulting, battering, and raping her by having nonconsensual vaginal intercourse and other nonconsensual sexual contact with her. Due to her known intoxication, Ms. ██████████ was incapable of giving legal consent to ██████████ for any sexual contact pursuant to, without limitation, Penal Code 261(a)(3). Because, without limitation, ██████████ had job duties dealing with alcohol, he should have been trained on the identification of intoxicated persons and related policies and procedures to deal with intoxicated persons. Ms. ██████████ is informed and believes that ██████████ received no such training from Pechanga.

Ms. ██████████ yelled for ██████████ to get off of her. ██████████ admitted to law enforcement that he sucked on Ms. ██████████'s left breast, that his nose at some point touched Ms. ██████████'s vagina, that he began rubbing his penis on Ms. ██████████'s vagina, that he inserted his penis into her vagina, and that he ejaculated on Ms. ██████████'s leg. ██████████ eventually exited the room. At all relevant times, ██████████ was on the clock in the course and scope of his duties of his employment with Pechanga.

Ms. ██████████ promptly called the front desk and reported the incident. She informed the employee who answered the phone that she had been raped. Ms. ██████████ is informed and believes that Pechanga negligently and/or knowingly informed ██████████ of Ms. ██████████'s report prior to informing law enforcement. Instead of keeping ██████████ at the resort to speak with investigating officers, Pechanga negligently allowed and/or knowingly assisted ██████████ in creating a false alibi by allowing him to leave work early to go to the hospital for a feigned "health issue."

After security and law enforcement arrived at the scene, Ms. ██████████ was transported to Temecula Valley Hospital via American Medical Response. Riverside County Sheriff Department's Incident Report ("Incident Report") is attached hereto as **Attachment D**. Sexual Assault Response Team ("SART") nurse Michelle Shores ("SART Nurse Shores") confirmed the following: (1) injury to Ms. ██████████'s vagina; (2) bruising of Ms. ██████████'s breast consistent with bite marks; and (3) foreign piece of hair (with root) on Ms. ██████████. (See Attach. D, Incident Report, p. 8.)

The negligent and/or tortious actions and/or omissions of Pechanga, [REDACTED], and other Pechanga employees within the course and scope of their employment with Pechanga violated Ms. [REDACTED]'s civil rights, including pursuant to, without limitation, the Unruh Civil Rights Act, Civ. Code § 52 and Ralph Civil Rights Act, Civ. Code § 51.7.

But for the negligent and/or tortious acts and/or omissions of Pechanga, [REDACTED], and other Pechanga employees within the course and scope of their employment, Ms. [REDACTED] would not have suffered the injuries stated herein.

IV. NAME OF ANY GAMING OPERATION EMPLOYEE INVOLVED

As required pursuant to Tribal Ordinance § 10(b)(3), Claimant Michele [REDACTED] provides the names of Pechanga Resort Casino/Gaming Operation employees known at this time to her:

- [REDACTED], Pechanga Resort Casino Guest Services Supervisor.

Furthermore, Claimant identifies and incorporates by reference Riverside County Sherriff Department's Incident Report attached hereto as **Attachment D**. Plaintiff will request additional discovery regarding this issue.

V. STATEMENT OF NATURE AND EXTENT OF CLAIMANT'S INJURY

As required pursuant to Tribal Ordinance § 10(b)(4), Claimant Michele [REDACTED] provides the following information related to the nature and extent of the injuries she suffered as a result of the March 14, 2020 incident described hereinabove. Pursuant to Tribal Ordinance § 5(c), Claimant provides information related to the following compensable injuries in tort claims against Gaming Operations: bodily injury and personal injury arising out of, connected with, or relating to the operation of Pechanga Resort Casino and/or activities associated therewith.

As a result of the negligence and/or other tortious actions and/or omissions of Pechanga Resort Casino, [REDACTED]a, and other Pechanga employees within the course and scope of their employment, including without limitation Pechanga Guest Services Supervisor [REDACTED], Plaintiff's injuries include, without limitation, the following:

- Sexual assault and battery;
- Gender violence;
- Injuries to Claimant's body, including without limitation Claimant's vagina and breasts;
- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder;
- Pain of mind and body, shock, emotional distress, embarrassment, loss of self-esteem, disgrace, humiliation, and loss of enjoyment of life;
- Depression, anxiety, and emotional distress;

- Expenses for medical and psychological treatment, therapy, and counseling;
- Loss of earnings and earning capacity;
- Civil rights violations, including without limitation pursuant to Unruh Civil Rights Act, Civ. Code § 52 and Ralph Civil Rights Act, Civ. Code § 51.7; and
- Statutory and treble damages which are neither exemplary nor punitive.

VI. STATEMENT OF ALL MEDICAL DAMAGES INCURRED

Pursuant to Tribal Ordinance § 10(b)(5), Claimant provides the following written statement of medical damages incurred. As a result of the negligence and/or tortious actions and/or omissions of Pechanga Resort Casino, [REDACTED], and other Pechanga employees within the course and scope of their employment, including without limitation Pechanga Supervisor [REDACTED], Plaintiff's injuries include, without limitation, the following:

- Injuries to Claimant's body, including without limitation Claimant's vagina and breasts;
- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder;
- Pain, depression, anxiety, and emotional distress; and
- Expenses for medical and psychological treatment, therapy, and counseling.


VII. STATEMENT OF EXACT AMOUNT OF MONETARY DAMAGES REQUESTED

Pursuant to your correspondence of March 30, 2020 wherein you have advised of your representation of the above captioned, please be advised that the purpose of this response is to acknowledge same regarding a cause of action (claim) that you intend to file and pursue on her behalf.

Firstly please be advised that the Pechanga Resort Casino is a self-insured wholly-owned tribal government project of the Pechanga Band of Luiseno Mission Indians, a sovereign federally-recognized Indian Tribe. The project is conducted pursuant to the Tribal-State Gaming Compact (*Compact*) between the Tribe and the State of California and shares all aspects of the Tribe's sovereign immunity.

Pursuant to the *Compact* you are hereby being noticed that all claims brought against the Pechanga Resort Casino asserting personal injury must be filed under the *Pechanga Gaming Facility Tort Liability Act of 2008 (Tribal Ordinance)* within 180-days of your receipt of this notice and all claims are required to be exhausted in the therein described Tribal Dispute Resolution Process. A copy of the *Tribal Ordinance* is available by addressing a request to: The Pechanga Office of General Counsel, P.O. Box 1477, Temecula, CA 92593. If at the end of the prescribed process your client is dissatisfied with the result, she may then be entitled to arbitration before a retired judge.

36 **SCENE DESCRIPTION:**

37 The scene was in room 10470 on the fourth floor of Pechanga Resort and Casino in what is known as Tower one. The room was the very last suite on the left side of the hallway. As you enter the suite, there was a living room straight ahead and a sink and counter directly to the left of the entrance. Below the counter was a mini refrigerator. On the counter was an open bottle of champagne. To the right of the entrance was a door leading to the bathroom. Further into the living room was another door to the left, leading to the bedroom. In the center of the bedroom was the bed and on the bed was a pair of women's flowery pajama pants. On either side of the bed was a night stand with a lamp on it. On the night stand to the left of the bed was an empty glass. Further to the left of the bed was a chair and foot stool. On the foot stool were several pieces of clothing. To the far right of the bedroom was a door leading to the bathroom.

1 DETAILS:

2
3 On 03/15/2020, I was working uniformed patrol in the unincorporated area of Temecula, county
4 of Riverside. At 0030 hours, I was dispatched to Pechanga Resort and Casino, located at 45000
5 Pechanga Parkway in the unincorporated area of Temecula, reference a reported rape. The text of
6 the call stated a guest claimed she was raped by an employee inside her hotel room. (VIC) The
7 victim was transported to Temecula Valley Hospital (TVH) via American Medical Response
8 (AMR) prior to my arrival. I arrived on scene at 0055 hours, turned on my body worn camera and
9 contacted Pechanga Department of Public Safety Detective (DPS) (OTH) Don Lamora. Lamora
10 told me the following:

11
12 Lamora was notified by his dispatch center there was a complaint out of room 10470 involving the
13 victim and possibly an employee of the business. Lamora went to the location and met (OTH) Jan-
14 [REDACTED] (the hotel manager) and a female DPS agent. Together, the three contacted the
15 victim who told Lamora the following:

16
17 The victim is the only one registered to the room and the only one who had keys to the room. At
18 approximately 2330 hours the victim called the front desk to report her key wasn't working and
19 needed someone to bring her a new key. While the victim was waiting, an employee (later
20 identified as [REDACTED]) stood by with the victim. [REDACTED] brought a new key up. [REDACTED]
21 [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] opened the room for the victim, and she went inside.

22
23 The victim stated [REDACTED] later came back to her room and entered the room. [REDACTED]
24 forced the victim into the bedroom, threw her onto the bed, started sucking her nipple and ended
25 up "fucking" her. The victim then stated she got him away from her. Lamora stated the victim was
26 very intoxicated and embarrassed by what happened, and it was difficult to get a good statement
27 from her. This concluded Lamora's interview with the victim.

28
29 Lamora contacted [REDACTED] who told him the following:

30
31 [REDACTED] and part of his job is to walk each floor and collect any
32 food service trays left in the hallway. [REDACTED] was walking the floor and observed the victim
33 sitting in the elevator lobby and asked why she was there. The victim explained she was not able
34 to get into her room because her key was not working. [REDACTED] tried to help her open her
35 door but was unable to. The victim was drunk so [REDACTED] waited with her until a new key
36 was brought up and she got back into her room.

37
38 A little while later, [REDACTED] was walking the floor and had another encounter with the victim.
39 During the second encounter, the victim was out of her room and asked [REDACTED] to help her
40 with the service bar in her room. [REDACTED] entered the room and helped the victim open the
41 service bar. The victim got a bottle of champagne out of the service bar and [REDACTED] left the
42 room. This concluded Lamora's interview with [REDACTED]

1 Lamora stated there is no video surveillance in any of the hallways of the hotel, however, there is
2 video surveillance in the elevator lobby that may show him coming and going. I concluded my
3 interview with Lamora and provided him a business card and file number.
4

5 I relocated to room 10470 on the fourth floor of Tower one. I photographed the scene and began
6 collecting possible evidence. I collected a scarf, a pair of thong underwear, a pair of jeans, and a
7 black long sleeve shirt from the chair and foot rest to the left of the bed. I collected a pair of black
8 and white flower pajama pants from the bed and a long sleeve shirt from a table in the living room.
9 I bagged each item in separate brown paper bags and began filling out an RSD 409 Report Form.
10

11 I received a phone call from Sergeant Liebrand #3633 who told me to stop what I was doing, lock
12 down the room and go interview the victim. I had Lamora and [REDACTED] lock down the room so
13 only [REDACTED] (the hotel manager) could enter the room. I also requested they monitor the lock to
14 ensure no one else entered the room. I relocated to TVH and contacted the victim in room two of
15 the Emergency Room. The victim told me the following:
16

17 The victim came from out of town to see a popular band, Sing, play a concert at the location. The
18 victim came to the hotel by herself and was the only one staying in room 10470. Earlier in the
19 evening, the victim was down in the casino gambling. Throughout the night the victim had
20 approximately six "Tito's Vodkas," four glasses of wine and felt like she was drunk. The victim
21 went to the piano bar after the casino and at approximately 2330 hours, returned to her room. When
22 the victim arrived at her room, she discovered her key was not working. The victim went back to
23 the elevator lobby, called the front desk from the guest phone and asked that someone bring her a
24 new key.
25

26 While she was there waiting, [REDACTED] walked up from an unknown direction and asked what
27 was wrong. The victim explained the situation to [REDACTED], and he offered to take her down
28 to her room to see if he could get the key to work. [REDACTED] attempted to get the victim's key
29 to work but he could not. [REDACTED] asked the victim if her boyfriend or husband was inside
30 the room because it appeared someone was inside preventing the door from opening. The victim
31 stated she was at the hotel alone and did not have a boyfriend or husband with her. [REDACTED]
32 asked her two more times if she had a boyfriend or husband in the room and she again told him
33 she was alone. A few minutes later, [REDACTED] arrived at the hotel room and opened the door for
34 the victim, and she went into the room.
35

36 The victim changed into her pajamas, brushed her teeth and laid down to go to bed. A couple
37 minutes later, the victim heard a knock at the door. She went to open the door and saw [REDACTED]
38 [REDACTED] standing there. [REDACTED] stated, "I'm just here to make sure everything is okay." [REDACTED]
39 [REDACTED] asked if there was anything the victim needed. She stated she was tired and just wanted
40 to go back to bed. [REDACTED] continued asking if there was anything he could get for her. The
41 victim finally told [REDACTED] he could get her a glass of champagne and she went to lay back
42 down in bed.
43

1 The victim fell back asleep and woke up with [REDACTED] on top of her and his penis inside her
2 mouth. The victim told [REDACTED] to "get the fuck off me," and he did. The victim went in and
3 out of sleep and [REDACTED] vaginally penetrated her with his penis for approximately two to
4 three minutes. The victim had no pain to her vagina and believes [REDACTED] only inserted his
5 penis into her vagina one time. While he was penetrating her vagina, [REDACTED] a began sucking
6 the victims left nipple which was extremely painful and caused the victim to wake up completely.
7 The victim yelled at [REDACTED] to get off her. He did and then proceeded to wipe her vagina
8 and leg off with a towel. The victim told [REDACTED] to "get the fuck out of here," and he left.
9 The victim could feel [REDACTED]'s penis inside her vagina and believes he ejaculated inside her
10 vagina. The victim stated she remembers [REDACTED] was not circumcised.

11
12 The victim sat up in bed wondering what had just happened to her. She drank the glass of
13 champagne that was on the table next to the bed. The victim called the front desk trying to get
14 ahold of her boyfriend. The employee the victim spoke to on the phone, asked what was wrong.
15 The victim stated she thought she had been raped. The victim stated Pechanga security and
16 emergency medical personnel arrived and she was taken to the hospital. I concluded my interview
17 with the victim and provided her a business card and file number. The victim was also provided a
18 MARSY's card, information about the Southwest Family Justice Center and the resources they
19 provide, and a sexual assault information pamphlet.

20
21 During my interview with the victim, she was very emotional and at times was embarrassed to
22 answer my questions. The victim told her story to me, consistently, three times. The victim's
23 boyfriend arrived at TVH and she kept apologizing to him for what had happened. I called Forensic
24 Nurses of Southern California and requested a Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) nurse come
25 to conduct a SART exam. (OTH) Michelle Shores arrived at the hospital and conducted a SART
26 exam.

27
28 I relocated to Pechanga Resort and Casino and contacted [REDACTED] who told me the following:

29
30 The front desk received a call at approximately 2315 hours from the victim. She was very
31 belligerent and upset because her room key didn't work. At approximately 2325, a second call was
32 received from the victim still requesting a room key. [REDACTED] made her a new room key.
33 Approximately five minutes later, [REDACTED] went up to the room to open the door and observed
34 the victim laying on the ground in front of her room. [REDACTED] observed [REDACTED] standing
35 next to the victim. [REDACTED] opened the door and gave the room key to the victim. [REDACTED]
36 helped the victim up and she entered the room.

37
38 Both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] walked back towards the elevators and parted ways again. An
39 unknown amount of time later, [REDACTED] received another call regarding the victim in which she
40 was claiming she was raped. [REDACTED] and Lamora relocated to room 10470 and waited for a
41 female officer and emergency medical personnel to arrive. [REDACTED] opened the door and allowed
42 the DPS detectives and emergency medical personnel into the room. [REDACTED] had no further
43 contact with VIC 1. I concluded my interview with [REDACTED].
44

1 I relocated to TVH and collected the SART exam results and evidence from Shores. Shores told
2 me she discovered bruising to VIC 1's left breast and to her vaginal area which is consistent with
3 VIC 1's statement. I concluded my interview with Shores and provided her a business card and
4 file number for her records.

6 I request this report be forwarded to Southwest Investigations for continued investigation.

34 This is a supplemental report regarding a rape that occurred at 45000 Pechanga Parkway, in the
35 City of Temecula, County of Riverside on March 15, 2020. For more information about this

38 I arrived at the Pechanga Hotel and Casino and contacted Investigator Gasparini. Investigator
39 Gasparini assigned Deputy Reed #3237, the Riverside Sheriff's Forensic Service Bureau and I to
40 process hotel room 10470 in Tower 1 where the rape occurred.

42 Investigator Franchville #3136 contacted the victim, Jane Doe who signed a permission to search
43 form, allowing us to search her hotel room for evidence.

1 Forensic Technician Hayward #N4816, Forensic Technician Kopitzke #N3863, Deputy Reed and
2 I went to the hotel room and met ~~Paul Council~~ #06408 the Pechanga Hotel Shift Manager.
3 ~~Council~~ was standing outside of the hotel room providing security. ~~Council~~ opened the door to
4 room 10470 at approximately 0905 hours, at which time Forensic Technicians Hayward and

DETAILS

I am currently an Investigator for the Riverside County Sheriff's Department assigned to the Southwest Station. I was called into work to assist with a rape investigation that occurred at the Pechanga Casino located at 45000 Pechanga Parkway, unincorporated area of Temecula.

Investigator Angel Gasparini is the primary investigator assigned to the case. Gasparini and I responded to the Pechanga Casino to talk to those who first responded to the scene. Deputy Matt Johnson is the primary patrol deputy handling the case. Johnson told me the Victim reported that she was raped by a casino employee. The casino believes employee [REDACTED] is the person who committed the crime based on the Victim's description and [REDACTED] was seen with the Victim by his supervisor (see supplemental reports for details). The Victim was transported to the hospital for a Sexual Assault Examination and [REDACTED] was transported to a different hospital for complaint of chest pains.

Investigator Gasparini asked me to contact the Victim to make sure we have positive identification and permission to search the hotel room (scene location). I drove to the Southwest Station and made a Six-pack photo Line-up. I responded to the Temecula Valley Hospital where the Victim was in Emergency Room #02.

Prior to talking to the Victim, I spoke to SART Nurse Michelle Shores who told me she found injury to the Victim's vagina, bruising to the Victim's left breast consistent with bite marks, and a foreign piece of hair (with root) on the Victim that seemed darker than the Victim's hair. This information was relayed to Investigator Gasparini.

I recorded and introduced myself to the Victim. She was being visited and supported by her boyfriend, [REDACTED]. 31 On March 15, 2020, at about 0300 hours, I was called out to investigate a rape that occurred at the
32 Pechanga Resort and Casino, which was located at 45000 Pechanga Parkway in the city of
33 Temecula (Riverside County, CA). After I assumed control of the investigation, I learned that the
34 victim, Jane Doe, had been transported to the Temecula Valley hospital because she wanted to
35 have a rape examination done on her. I also learned that the suspect, [REDACTED], had also been taken
36 to the hospital because he was complaining of chest pain after his employer asked him to provide
37 a written statement about his interactions with Jane Doe.
38

39 **Briefing from Deputy Johnson:**

40
41 I began my investigation by responding to the Pechanga Resort and Casino with Investigator
42 Franchville. At the casino, at about 0513 hours, I received a briefing from Deputy Johnson, ID
43 #5348, about the investigative steps he took after he arrived at the casino. Deputy Johnson told me
44 that the rape occurred in building number 1, hotel room 10470, on the 4th floor tower hotel of the

1 Pechanga Resort and Casino. Deputy Johnson said the room had been rented to an a 50-year-old
2 female named Jane Doe. Deputy Johnson said that Jane Doe was raped by a Pechanga resort
3 employee.
4

5 Deputy Johnson said he arrived on scene and then received a briefing from Pechanga detectives.
6 Deputy Johnson said he began taken photos of the hotel room, which was followed by him
7 collecting evidence. At some point, Deputy Johnson's supervisor told him to stop processing the
8 hotel room until detectives arrive on scene. Deputy Johnson said his supervisor directed him to
9 respond to the hospital and speak with the victim, Jane Doe. For more information on Deputy

13

14 On March 15, 2020, at 0612 hours, I conducted an interview with Pechanga EMTs [REDACTED]
15 and [REDACTED]. My interview with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were audio recorded for evidence. The
16 following is a summary of my interview with both of these EMT's:
17

18 [REDACTED] said that he and [REDACTED] received a call last night from their dispatch that there was a female
19 in a hotel room who stated she had been raped and wanted to have a rape kit done. [REDACTED] said he
20 was told that the female was also intoxicated. Afterwards, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] both head up to the
21 fourth floor of the casino tower. [REDACTED] said he knocked on room 10470 and he could Jane Doe
22 yelling from inside the room. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe answered the door and was crying. [REDACTED]
23 said Jane Doe told him that she was embarrassed. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe was revealed because she
24 completely naked from the waist down and she had a black shirt on that was revealing her breasts.
25

26 [REDACTED] said he and [REDACTED] along with a female safety officer, walked into the bedroom. [REDACTED]
27 said Jane Doe sat down on the bed and told them that she was covered up but she took everything
28 off so they could see how the suspect left her. [REDACTED] asked Jane Doe if she would like to cover
29 up, so she was given a robe by the female officer. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe began disclosing what had
30 happened to her. [REDACTED] told me that Jane Doe said a male assisted her into her room and he said
31 he was going to take care of her, but she said no several times. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe admitted to
32 consuming a lot of alcohol. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe blamed herself because she said she should not
33 have consumed that much alone.
34

35 [REDACTED] said Jane Doe's demeanor went from hysterical to calm. [REDACTED] said he then called for an
36 ambulance and the fire department. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe wanted to be checked with a rape kit.
37 [REDACTED] said he told Jane Doe that the rape kits are done at the hospital. [REDACTED] said he checked
38 Jane Doe's vital signs and monitored her until the ambulance arrived. I asked [REDACTED] and Justin if
39 there were any signs of struggle inside the bedroom and [REDACTED] said no. [REDACTED] said he heard a
40 Pechanga detective asking Jane Doe if she would be able to identify her assailant and she said yes.
41 [REDACTED] said Jane Doe said the man was [REDACTED] clean shave, and was wearing black pants and a
42 blue shirt. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had no further information.

2 On March 15, 2020, at 0628 hours, I conducted an interview with [REDACTED], a Pechanga Guest
3 Services Supervisor. My interview with [REDACTED] was audio recorded for evidence. The following is a
4 summary of my interview with [REDACTED].
5

6 [REDACTED] told me that his role as a supervisor is to make sure the hotel front desk is running smoothly.
7 [REDACTED] said he works from 11 PM to 7:30 AM. [REDACTED] said his job requires him to deal with any type of
8 customer complaint that may arise inside the hotel. I asked [REDACTED] to tell me if anything last night
9 while he was working. [REDACTED] said at around 11:15 PM, he received a call from reservations that Jane
10 Doe was locked out of her room because her key card was not working. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe was
11 being rude and vulgar with team members. About 10 minutes later, [REDACTED] asked one of his staff
12 members if Jane Doe ever came down to get a new key card. [REDACTED] was told that Jane Doe had calmed
13 down and was still waiting for a new key card to be brought up. [REDACTED] said he made a new key card
14 and went up to the fourth floor. [REDACTED] said he was heading to room 10470. [REDACTED] said that as he walked
15 up to room 10470, she was laying on the floor next to her door. [REDACTED] said there was a team member,
16 [REDACTED] standing next to Jane Doe.
17

18 As [REDACTED] is approaching Jane Doe, he can hear her say that she was upset about having to wait for
19 so long to get new keys. [REDACTED] said he told Jane Doe that the room card can easily be demagnetized.
20 [REDACTED] said he only made one key for Jane Doe. [REDACTED] said he made sure the new key card worked on
21 Jane Doe's door, which it did. [REDACTED] said he handed the key card to Jane Doe, and he noticed that
22 she had trouble standing up because she was so intoxicated. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] reached his hand
23 out and helped Jane Doe stand up. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe walked into the room and continues
24 complaining by saying this is not okay. [REDACTED] said the door closes behind Jane Doe. [REDACTED] said he
25 walked away from the room with [REDACTED].
26

27 At about 12:15 AM, [REDACTED] said he got a call from dispatch indicating that Jane Doe had called and
28 indicating that she had been raped. [REDACTED] said he had only been gone for about an hour, so the entire
29 situation seemed odd. [REDACTED] said he went upstairs with a Pechanga Detective named Don. [REDACTED] said
30 he waited for the EMT's and a female Pechanga police officer before making contact with Jane
31 Doe. Afterwards, [REDACTED] said he stood out in the hall until one of the EMT's came out of the room
32 and said Jane Doe did not want to go to the hospital. [REDACTED] said eventually the EMT's requested a
33 medical transport for Jane Doe. [REDACTED] said he heard Jane Doe describe her abuser. Jane Doe initially
34 described him, but then changed the description to what [REDACTED] looked like. [REDACTED] had no further
35 information, so I concluded my conversation with him.
36

37 **Suspect Interview with [REDACTED]:**
38

39 On March 15, 2020, at 0908 hours, I conducted a digitally recorded interview with [REDACTED] at
40 the Southwest Station interview room 1. The following is a summary of my interview with [REDACTED].
41 [REDACTED]
42

43 After I obtained some general information from [REDACTED], I explained to him that he was under
44 arrest. Therefore, I had to advise him of his Miranda rights before we begin. [REDACTED] understood all

1 his rights and he agreed to speak with me. Under Miranda, Jose told me the following:
2

3 [REDACTED] told me he works as a [REDACTED] captain for the Pechanga Resort and Casino. [REDACTED] said he
4 manages [REDACTED] and the [REDACTED] staff. [REDACTED] said he worked a night shift
5 last night starting at 2200 hours. [REDACTED] said he only has one server to assist him, so he is required to
6 assist with delivering orders to customers within the hotel. I asked [REDACTED] how many deliveries he
7 did last night and he said three. I asked [REDACTED] to tell me about what happened last night.
8

9 [REDACTED] said he had a few deliveries last night. [REDACTED] said his first order was for Mr. Williams in room
10 10465. [REDACTED] went to back down to the kitchen area to help set things up. Afterwards, [REDACTED] said Mr.
11 [REDACTED] placed another order for milk and water. [REDACTED] said that as he walked by a landing area on
12 the fourth floor, there was a lady (Jane Doe) arguing on the telephone that nobody was bringing
13 her keys for her room. [REDACTED] said he decided to help Jane Doe by calling the front desk for her. [REDACTED]
14 said he requested that a new key be made for Jane Doe. After making a phone call for Jane Doe,
15 [REDACTED] said she could just walk back to her room until someone brings her a new key card.
16

17 [REDACTED] said he tried to open Jane Doe's room with the key card she was having issues with. [REDACTED] said
18 the key card light blinked yellow, which means the door is locked from the inside. [REDACTED] asked Jane
19 Doe if someone was in her room and she said no. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe began saying she was scared.
20 [REDACTED] said Jane Doe tried to hug him, so he stepped aside to avoid her. Afterwards, [REDACTED] said a
21 supervisor named [REDACTED] arrived and provided Jane Doe with a new key card. [REDACTED] said he watched
22 Jane Doe struggle to stand up while she was arguing with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said he decided to help Jane
23 Doe out by helping her stand up. Once Jane Doe stood up and her room was unlocked, [REDACTED] said
24 he returned back to his work post.
25

26 Later in the night, [REDACTED] said he went up to the fourth floor to check for any order trays that were
27 left in the hallway. [REDACTED] said he walked towards room 10470 and saw Jane Doe outside of her room
28 again. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe told him that she could not open the door to the mini bar. [REDACTED] asked
29 Jane Doe if he may come into her room because he needed her permission to enter. Also, [REDACTED] said
30 he called his order taker from his cell phone to see if she could provide him with the name of the
31 guest assigned to the room and to verify if Jane Doe had charging privileges. [REDACTED] said he entered
32 Jane Doe's room and he said she was trying to open the mini bar from the wrong side. [REDACTED] showed
33 Jane Doe how to open the refrigerator. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe asked him to take out a small bottle of
34 champagne. [REDACTED] said he opened the champagne and poured a drink into a glass for Jane Doe. [REDACTED]
35 said he left the room after this.
36

37 After leaving Jane Doe's room, [REDACTED] said he went to the restroom because he was not feeling good.
38 [REDACTED] said he started feeling dizzy and asked his order taker to call EMS to check on him. [REDACTED] said
39 he was told he needed to go to the hospital because of his blood pressure. [REDACTED] was taken to the
40 hospital. After this initial statement, [REDACTED] provided me with several different versions of what
41 happened inside of Jane Doe's room. Each time, [REDACTED] would provide more details on what
42 happened sexually between him and Jane Doe. The following is a summary of [REDACTED] combined
43 stories.
44

1 I asked [REDACTED] to give me all the details from the time he first met Jane Doe to the point where he
2 left her room. [REDACTED] said that around 11 forty-something, he went to deliver an order to room 10465.
3 [REDACTED] said he saw Jane Doe sitting on a table next to the landing phone. [REDACTED] said he heard Jane Doe
4 asking for assistance. [REDACTED] said he helped Jane Doe by calling the front desk to order key assistance.
5 A [REDACTED] walked to room 10465 to deliver an order, Jane Doe began following behind him. After
6 [REDACTED] delivered the order, he told Jane Doe that he would try to open her door with her room keys.
7 [REDACTED] said he tried both room keys and the lights just flashed orange. [REDACTED] said that the orange lights
8 usually indicate that someone is inside a locked room.

9
10 [REDACTED] said Jane Doe began acting scared because she was afraid someone was inside her room. [REDACTED]
11 said Jane Doe began trying to give him a hug, so he moved to the side. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe hugged
12 him from behind and said, "I am so scared now." [REDACTED] said Jane Doe then began trying to kiss him
13 on the ear. [REDACTED] said he told Jane Doe no when she tried to kiss him. [REDACTED] said he called the front
14 desk to see if the keys were on the way. At this time, [REDACTED] said Jane Doe sat down by her door and
15 she began blowing him kisses. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe asked him if he would stay with her, and she
16 asked him several times to stop by. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe asked him when he would be leaving. [REDACTED]
17 said he did not respond to Jane Doe and he just laughed at her because she was so drunk.

18
19 [REDACTED] said the [REDACTED] arrived on scene and asked Jane Doe for ID, which caused her to start screaming.
20 [REDACTED] said he extended his hand out to help Jane Doe get to her feet. [REDACTED] said he left Jane Doe with
21 [REDACTED] after she was able to stand up. Sometime later, [REDACTED] said he was checking the fourth floor for
22 tables and dishes. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe was looking for somebody to help her with the Minnie bar.
23 [REDACTED] said he looked around and noticed there were no guests in the hallway. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe
24 closed her door as he was walking towards her room. [REDACTED] said he knocked on Jane Doe's door
25 and he asked her if she was having problems with the mini bar. [REDACTED] said he asked Jane Doe what
26 was going on. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe told him that first her keys were not working and now her mini
27 bar will not open.

28
29 [REDACTED] said that while he was talking with Jane Doe, one of her "boobs" was hanging out through
30 her black spaghetti strapped shirt. [REDACTED] said he left the door bolt out so the door would not
31 completely shut. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe locked the door behind him and he could tell that she was
32 wasted. [REDACTED] said he opened the mini bar for Jane Doe and offered to get her a bottle, which she
33 agreed to. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe began touching him as he tried opening the bottle of alcohol. [REDACTED]
34 said he poured the alcohol into a glass and handed it to Jane Doe. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe grabbed his
35 hand and would not let it go. While holding onto him, [REDACTED] said Jane Doe took off her pajama
36 pants. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe began taking him into her bedroom. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe began pulling
37 him towards her breast. [REDACTED] said he sucked on Jane Doe's left breast with his mouth.

38
39 [REDACTED] said Jane Doe then began pulling his face towards her vagina. [REDACTED] said he never put his
40 tongue inside of Jane Doe's vagina, but his mouth was there and so was his nose. [REDACTED] said his
41 nose did touch Jane Doe's vagina. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe grabbed his hand and told him to put his
42 fingers inside her vagina. [REDACTED] said he told Jane Doe that he had to go. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe began
43 pulling him from his vest, which was followed by her grabbing onto his penis. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe
44 undid his belt and then took his pants off. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe began making him horny, which was

1 followed by her licking his penis for about 5 to 10 seconds. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe moved to the edge
2 of the bed, laid on her back, and spread her legs apart. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe asked him to put his
3 penis inside of her. [REDACTED] said he began losing his erection so he could not put his penis inside of
4 Jane Doe. [REDACTED] said he began rubbing his penis on Jane Doe's vagina.
5

6 [REDACTED] said he was exited from the beginning, which caused him to ejaculate on Jane Doe's leg.
7 Afterwards, [REDACTED] said he left the room. [REDACTED] said he recalls Jane Doe telling him to get out of her
8 room. However, [REDACTED] said Jane Doe was the one forcing him to do things against his will. [REDACTED] said
9 Jane Doe never told him to stop. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe's speech was slurred, but she did not seem to
10 be that intoxicated. [REDACTED] said he remembers Jane Doe getting a Kleenex napkin to wipe the
11 ejaculate off her leg. [REDACTED] said he left after Jane Doe laid down on the bed. I asked [REDACTED] if he put
12 his penis inside of Jane Doe and he said he was inside of her for around 5 seconds because he was
13 not even that horny. I asked [REDACTED] if he thinks what he did was wrong, and [REDACTED] said yes because it
14 was a guest and he was working at the time. I asked [REDACTED] if he thinks that Jane Doe's intoxication
15 made things worse and he said yes. [REDACTED] said the intoxication made things worse because Jane Doe
16 said that he was the one who forced her. [REDACTED] said Jane Doe forced herself upon him. [REDACTED] had no
17 further information. I concluded my interview with [REDACTED]
18

19 Supplemental Reports:

20
21 Investigator Franchville assisted me with conducting a six-pack photo line-up with Jane Doe,
22 where she identified [REDACTED] as the person who raped her. Also, Jane Doe signed a
23 consent to search form for her hotel room. Deputy Ortiz and Deputy Reed processed the hotel
24 room for evidence. A SART exam was conducted to collect biological evidence from Jane Doe. A
25 sexual assault suspect examination was conducted of [REDACTED] to collect biological
26 evidence from him. Both the victim and suspect kits were sent to DOJ to be processed for evidence.
27

28 Interrogation Report for Door Lock, Bartech Printout, and Surveillance Video:

29
30 The Pechanga Resort and Casino provided me with a lock report for hotel room 10470. The report
31 shows when a key card is used to open a hotel room door. When Jane Doe checked into the
32 Pechanga Resort hotel, she was issued two key cards. In looking at the report, Jane Doe was
33 assigned KEY ID #101, which was first used on 03/14/20, at 1528 hours. The second time this
34 Key ID #101 was used was at 1941 hours. Since Jane Doe never used her second key card, it did
35 not show up on the interrogation report. Jane Doe was issued a new KEY ID #102 by management,
36 and was only used once on 03/14/20, at 2339 hours. I attached a copy of the interrogation to this
37 report.
38

39 The Bartech report I received from the Pechanga Resort and Casino is used to keep track of
40 purchases made from the Minibar. A purchase is made from the Minibar whenever an item is
41 removed from its location. For room 10470, there was an invoice created (highlighted in green)
42 for March 15, 2020, at 0103 hours for a MUMM NAPA 9. I attached a copy of the Bartech report
43 to the this report.
44

1 On March 17, 2020, Deputy Reed was provided with surveillance video from the Pechanga Resort
2 and Casino. I collected the surveillance video from Deputy Reed for evidence. In looking at the
3 surveillance video, Jane Doe can be seen inside an elevator. Jane Doe appears to have problems
4 with keeping her balance, which can be attributed to her level of intoxication. Also, [REDACTED] can be
5 seen working in the room service area of the casino. For some reason, I was having issues with the
6 proprietary surveillance software playing several parts of the video, which prevented me from
7 being able to view the video in its entirety.
8

9 Conclusion:

10
11 Based on my investigation, [REDACTED] admitted to having sex with Jane Doe while on duty as a room
12 service worker at the Pechanga Resort and Casino. [REDACTED] was later booked into CBDC for the
13 following two listed charges. This case will be forwarded to the DA's office for the prosecution of
14 [REDACTED] for 261 (a)(3) PC and 287 (i) PC.
