But I am also a pastor. I honestly feel no anger towards anyone, including

make poor choices. The driver of that SUV is eventually going to have to face

what he did.

I ask that people consider what happened with open hearts and minds, and

think about the assumptions they make about people – think about what

assumptions you make when you watch that video about who is bad or who is

good. In the end, those assumptions are not always right. And think about how to

act in a moment of high emotion. Do we react with fear and hatred in our hearts?

Or do we act with generosity and caring? How we respond in moments of crisis is
