## STATEMENT OF MARK BOROWSKI

Today the murderer of my sister, Lorry Ann, was released from prison. I am shaking at the thought that this murderer is walking free among us and without any legal restrictions, except those imposed by the Illinois Sex Offender Registration Act.

It makes me feel sick to my stomach that my mother and I feel that we need to constantly look over our shoulder and be concerned about any man who may resemble Thomas Kokoraleis.

I hoped that this day would never come, but unfortunately nothing more could be done to prevent his release.

Lorry Ann was my big sister. She was my hero and my mentor and the best role model a brother could have. I will always miss her and never forget her.

She is our morning butterfly. Every time we see a butterfly, we are reminded of her.

I am in full support of Ms. Allred's suggested change in Illinois law concerning all victims' families having a right to be afforded a no contact order against a sex offender who has victimized a family member, if a family member wishes to have such an order when a sex offender is released.

We plan to contact legislators to ask them to author and sponsor Lorry Ann's Law to help family members of victims of sexually motivated crimes in the future.
